#### History

Galltfaenan was the vision of Edith Adey-Jones, who was responsible for transforming the property into a dedicated care facility in the mid-1970s. Subsequently, The Old Rectory was brought into the fold in 1989, providing a welcome additional residence for those in need of specialist care.

After many years of dedication and service, Edith handed over the reins to her daughter, Diane, who remained active in the business until her untimely death in 2017.

Today, after more than four decades, the two homes have now passed into the third generation of devoted family ownership, with Diane's son, William, at the helm.
